

APPLICATION

- 1. The Applicant, Kevin Richard Kisilowsky, makes an application for declaratory judgment, pursuant to s. 24(1) of the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms* (hereafter "*The Charter*") THAT:
- (a) The freedom of conscience and religion, under s. 2(a) of the *Charter*, of the Applicant has been violated by the Respondent.
- (b) The Respondent acted contrary to the *Charter*, contrary to law, and unlawfully in violating the fundamental freedom of the Respondent.
- (c) The Respondent should cease from such a violation immediately.
- (d) The Respondent is ordered to accommodate the Applicant to the point of undue hardship and in a manner that recognizes and respects his fundamental freedom of conscience and religion and allows the Applicant to give effect to his sincerely held religious belief.
- (e) The Respondent is provided the right to decline such ceremonies that are in violation or offensive to his sincerely held beliefs.
- (f) Such further and other relief as this honourable Court may allow.
- (g) Costs of this application.
- 2. The grounds for the application are:
- (a) The Manitoba Vital Statistics Agency has required Kevin Kisilowsky to provide his services as a marriage commissioner to same-sex couples, or in the event he was opposed to doing so, to face the revocation of his appointment.
- (b) Mr. Kisilowsky has refused, on the basis of his sincerely-held religious beliefs, to provide his

services to same-sex couples; therefore his appointment as a marriage commissioner has been

revoked.

(c) Mr. Kisilowsky is entitled to be accommodated by the Government of Manitoba to the point of

undue hardship. The Government of Manitoba has not provided this or any accommodation to Mr.

Kisilowsky.

(d) The decision of the Manitoba Vital Statistics Agency to require the cancellation of Kevin

Kisilowsky's registration as a marriage commissioner due to his decision to refuse to marry same-sex

couples and to refuse to provide accommodation to the point of undue hardship infringes on Mr.

Kisilowsky's right to freedom of religion guaranteed by s. 2(a) of the Charter and cannot be saved by

s. 1 of the Charter.

3. The following documentary evidence will be used at the hearing of the application:

(a) The Affidavit of Kevin Kisilowsky, sworn March 12, 2014 and filed.

(b) Such further and other evidence as this Court may allow.
