

Governments can use digital ID to track and profile Canadians.

Privacy, security, and equality matter.

You can make a difference.



WHAT IS DIGITAL ID?

Digital ID is the electronic equivalent of traditional identification documents. such as driver's licenses or passports.

Governments are working hard to convince people that digital ID will improve lives: more security, convenience, and prosperity.

The federal government is planning to impose a digital ID "eco-system" that will fully integrate with current digital ID frameworks, such as the BC Services Card app or the MyAlberta Digital ID.

However, governments and government agencies sometimes use technologies like digital ID to monitor citizens and enforce compliance with government mandates.

WHAT'S AT STAKE?

Governments and policy designers have not properly considered the harmful impacts digital ID could have on your privacy, security, and equality.

Privacy matters. Governments can use digital ID to collect information about your behaviours, habits, interests, medical decisions, mobility, and financial transactions.

Security matters. Governments can use digital ID to restrict your access to goods and services, such as banking or travel.

Equality matters. Governments could give preferential treatment to digital ID users who give up their privacy or who display "correct" beliefs or behaviours.
