6.1 What Happened

Describe each event where you allegedly experienced discrimination under the Code.

1.* I am a municipal councilor who has experienced ongoing and targeted gender discrimination by The Grimsby Independent News (GIN), a local media outlet. GIN has engaged in a sustained pattern of discriminatory reporting rooted in gender bias and retaliation for my public advocacy on behalf of marginalized groups, particularly people with disabilities and 2SLGBTQQIA+.

As a public-facing service provider under the Ontario Human Rights Code, GIN has failed to uphold its duty to provide non-discriminatory services. Through its reporting and online platforms, GIN has created a threatening environment for me as an elected official, as a woman, and as an advocate for equity.

GIN's coverage relies on gender-coded language which is repeatedly used to undermine and delegitimize concerns—particularly around safety in political spaces—and casts doubt on my credibility.

2. * GIN has claimed that I incite "hate towards local men" and that "boogey-men" are needed for my false narrative. They refer to me as a "spin twin" and "Thelma and Louise". Additionally, I am referred to as one of the "witches of ward 3". Male colleagues are not subjected to the same framing or amount of scrutiny. In addition, GIN has repeatedly portrayed my disability-related advocacy as overreach or disruption, suggesting that my work to support accessible housing, inclusion, and tenant rights is excessive or politically self-serving. They claim my "emotions cloud judgment". They refer to my advocacy as "personal crusades "and not municipal priorities.

The news media outlet's failure to moderate harmful online comments on its platforms further contributes to a toxic and discriminatory environment. These comment sections have amplified sexist narratives and enabled public ridicule.

- 3. * "You need to REMOVE these two haridans!!!"
 - "The gerontophobic misandrist spin team pulled the post before the good townsfolk got a chance to read the morning news... witches of ward 3."
 - "probably recommended an access ramp!" a mocking comment clearly targeting my support for accessibility

The discrimination I have experienced is twofold: based on my gender and based on my visible and persistent advocacy for marginalized groups. This retaliation and inequitable treatment are in direct violation of Section 1 of the Ontario Human Rights Code.

The articles are in stark contrast to those of the male colleagues (rarely focused on) who are described as "unfiltered honesty" and "endearing".


