Dear Mr. Wolf:

Mount Allison University has received multiple concerns from members of our campus community regarding the location and nature of your displays near University property. While we respect your right to lawful expression, the University has determined that your presence near University premises creates safety concerns for students, staff, and faculty. These include disruption of pedestrian traffic, emotional distress for community members, and the potential for conflict in high-traffic areas.

You are hereby prohibited from entering or remaining on any Mount Allison University premises. This includes all University-owned land, buildings, and parking lots. Additionally, you are prohibited from attending or participating in any off-campus events that are hosted by or affiliated with Mount Allison University. This ban goes into effect immediately.

Please be advised that, having now been served with this notice, any future presence on Mount Allison property or involvement in university-affiliated events will constitute an offense under the Trespass Act of New Brunswick. In such cases, university officials will request that the local RCMP pursue trespassing charges.

If you believe you have legitimate academic or commercial business with Mount Allison University in the future, you must contact me in advance at 506-364-2249 to seek written permission.
