Welcome to the town of Lampman, located in the Southeastern part of Saskatchewan, where our population is less than 1000 but more than 600 (fluctuates). In this town and surrounding RM's, we the citizens pay our taxes diligently so that we can fund our communities, including but not limited to our property taxes that fund our public schools. There are families that can trace their genealogy back to the creation of the town or their family has owned the family farm for decades. Most of us know each other but there are times when fluctuating employment numbers flood our town with new people, some that stay, some that move on once the work is done. We are all striving to provide a safe, caring community raising our families to thrive.

We love our children and teach them the values and morals that were taught to us like respect for self and others, the difference between right and wrong, and how to be a good citizen. We rely on the knowledge that our kids are being taught the same lessons in their education setting that others are, so that we can all function as a successful society, looking out for one another. [Lampman School is a K-12 school, where the high-school end is for grade 7 and above therefore the washrooms are for students in this wing as young as in grade 6 as many of their classes are held in the high-school wing] When a situation arises that ultimately cuts off the parent or caregiver's ability to protect their children, feelings of being unheard and overlooked arise. This is where a large majority of parents are finding themselves right now. Frustrated with the fact that their ability to protect their children is, in essence, stripped away from them, due to the immediate threat of charges being laid for violating human rights, whilst the human rights for an entire group of students is being largely ignored.

The Saskatchewan Human Rights Commission states that their vision is "Saskatchewan is a national leader in advancing and protecting human rights and the *dignity of all*." We find this statement false. They also state that their mission is "We are a truth-seeking organization dedicated to promoting equality, *fairness*, and inclusion by protecting and educating all people in Saskatchewan about their duty to uphold human rights, *ensuring a safe and just society for all*." We also find this statement to be lacking in truth.

We are not trying to deny anything towards the one individual student who was biologically born Male but has identified themselves as Female, slowly changing their appearance, then name (although

we are not sure that they have “legally” filed for a name change but we call this “girl” her name as they have asked and have informed all in the school). We are however quite opposed to having male genitalia in a place that was once exclusively a private and safe space for the biological girls with female genitalia, complete with all the biological female processes such as monthly menstruation. For this particular situation, it would have been greatly beneficial to have their Mandate followed in particular “Support and *seek remedies* for individuals and groups who suffer discrimination.” There was no chance for a remedy to be sought, just a plain refusal to take the comfortability and safety away from a group of students along with their parents that voiced their disapproval at this latest request to access this space.

Due to these circumstances, we are asking for way forward to sort this particular situation out as there are several safety factors that have to be taken into account with this particular student and our school. Without getting into the particulars that have arose from this one individual student who allegedly is using this umbrella issue to their advantage to protect themselves from accessing places but suffice to say, they have made their peers feel unsafe and unwelcome. Is there is a process for this one individual to be monitored by an independent third party while a remedy is discussed, or may we submit a request for a cease order to be issued during this time period whereas the private lockable washroom located by the office, can be the main facility for this individual to utilize (thus ensuring that this individual maintains their privacy and safety, while the girls get their sense of safety back)

Please find attached a quote from each of the personal impact statements of some of these young students, who have taken the time to express their concerns. We will keep these statements and the girl’s identities private (unless they were comfortable with stating who they are). Failing to hear back with solutions, we will take the necessary next step in this process and start a petition to secure support in order to get this law re-examined (for more of a “fairness” and “dignity of all” approach) and re-written to include safety provisions for all parties (thus ensuring a *safe and just society for all*).
